# HIGHER SECONDARY EXAMINATION RESULTS

MARCH 2015

## GENERAL INFORMATION

**343459** candidates appeared for the Higher Secondary Examination, March 2015 from **1827** schools and **288362** became eligible for higher studies (EHS), the percentage of results for this year being **83.96**, last year the percentage was **79.39**. The department congratulates the **10839** students who got A+ in all subjects and the **151** candidates who secured 1200 scores out of 1200.

Result statistics reveal that of the **183460** girls who took the exam, **163908 (89.34%)** became eligible for higher studies, while from among the **159999** boys **124454 (77.78%)** qualified for higher studies. The statistics for the various streams show that in the science stream **149597 (85.71%)** candidates qualified for higher studies from the **174536** who took the exam, while in the humanities stream it is **54959 (78.84%)** candidates out of **69709**. And in the commerce stream **83806 (84.47%)** candidates qualified for higher studies among the **99214** candidates who appeared for the exam.

In the sector wise results the Aided sector tops with **86.91%** (out of **157301** candidates **136705** qualified for higher studies) followed by the Government sector **82.99%** (**123780** candidates out of **149147** became eligible for higher studies). In the unaided sector the percentage of E.H.S is **75.15** (**27659** candidates qualified for higher studies out of **36792**).

Eligibility for higher studies is D+ or above grade for all subjects with 30% scores in theory alone and an aggregate total of 30% in theory, practical evaluation and continuous evaluation taken together.

Double valuation was done for the answer scripts of Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics and the tabulations of scores of these subjects was done online. In the case of all other subjects tabulation was done in the Computer lab at the Directorate.

Among the districts, **Kozhikkode** District with a percentage of **87.05** tops the list while **Pathanamthitta** is the district with the lowest percentage ie. **76.17%**. **Thiruvananthapuram** District tops the list with **1248** candidates scoring A+ grade in all subjects.

Among the schools **St. Mary's HSS Pattom** presented the highest number of candidates for the exam ie. **763** and came out with a pass percentage of **94.89** followed by **SVHSS Palemaed** (**726** candidates **91.18%**) and **MSM HSS Kallingalparamba, Malappuram** (**639** Candidates **93.27%**)

### **TECHNICAL STREAM**

The Technical Stream of the Higher Secondary Course is run by Technical Schools. In the Technical Stream **1936** candidates took the Higher Secondary Examination, March 2014 from **14** technical schools. **1523** Candidates became eligible for higher studies, the pass percentage being **78.67** Last year it was **74.80%**.

### **ART STREAM**

The Art Stream is conducted in the Kalamandalam Art School. This year **60** students appeared for the Higher Secondary Examination and **54** qualified for higher studies. The pass percentage is **90**.

### **OPEN SCHOOL**

**82883** candidates appeared for the Higher Secondary Examination, March 2015 in various streams through Open School and **30624** qualified for higher studies. The percentage of results is **36.95** Last year it was **37.49**.

### **COMPARTMENTAL CANDIDATES**

Candidates who failed to become eligible for Higher Studies in the Higher Secondary Examinations of March 2007, 2008 and 2009 appeared for the Examination in March 2015 as Scheme II candidates. Out of **583** students in this category, **218** Students qualified for higher studies (**37.39%**).

Scheme I candidates of March 2010, 2011, 2012, 2013 and 2014 Higher Secondary Examinations who failed to attain D+ or above grades for all subjects and who had attended the First Year Higher Secondary Improvement Examination in September 2014 also registered for March 2015 Examination as Compartmental candidates under Scheme I. Out of **18322** students in this category, **6490** students qualified for higher studies (**35.42%**).

## **SAY/IMPROVEMENT EXAMINATION**

Those students who registered and appeared for the first time in the HSE 2015 March and failed to obtain sufficient grade for a pass in any subject can apply for the SAY examination to obtain D+ and above in such subjects. Those who appeared as compartmental candidates under Scheme I and Scheme II and obtained D+ or above in 5 subjects and remained in eligible in one subject can appear for the SAY examination to become eligible for higher studies. Compartmental candidates who remain ineligible for more than one subject cannot apply for SAY examination. Those students who appeared for the examination for the first time in March 2015 and obtained D+ or above in all subjects can also appear for any one subject at the SAY/Improvement examination so as to improve the grade obtained in that subject.

The 2015 SAY/IMP examination will be conducted from 08/06/2015 to 12/06/2015. The notification for the examination will be issued on 21/05/2015 and students who desire to appear for the examination shall submit the application in the schools in which they appeared for the March 2015 examination.

The department acknowledges the services rendered by the Higher Secondary School teachers, Principals, Staff members of the Higher Secondary Directorate, DPI, General Education Department, NIC, Kerala State IT Mission, BSNL and KSWAN to facilitate an error free declaration of results. Last but not the least sincere thanks are also due to the media and media persons who always supported us throughout the conduct of examination and valuation.

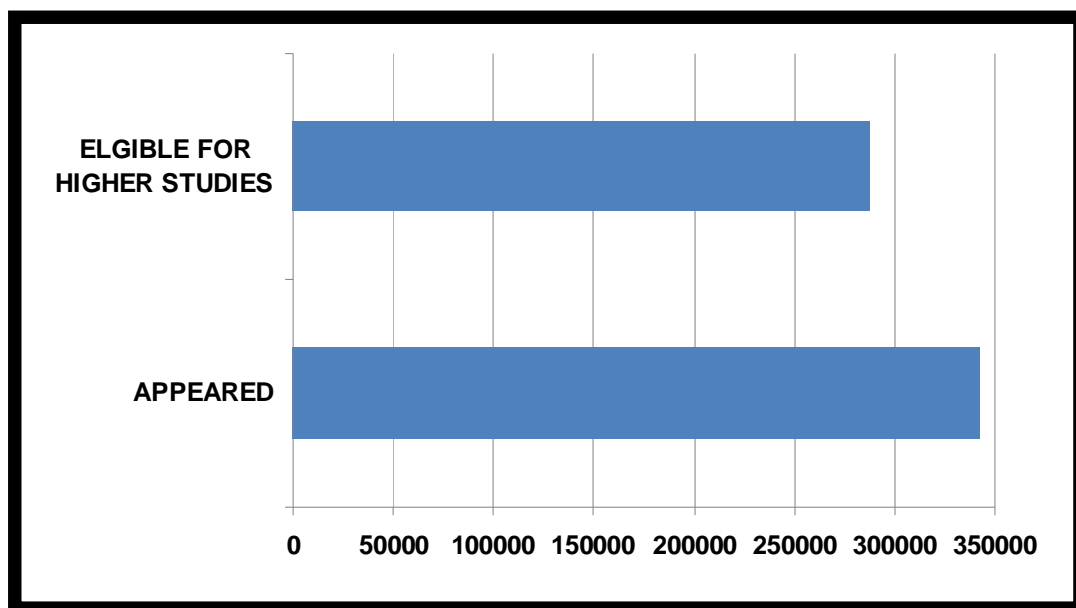

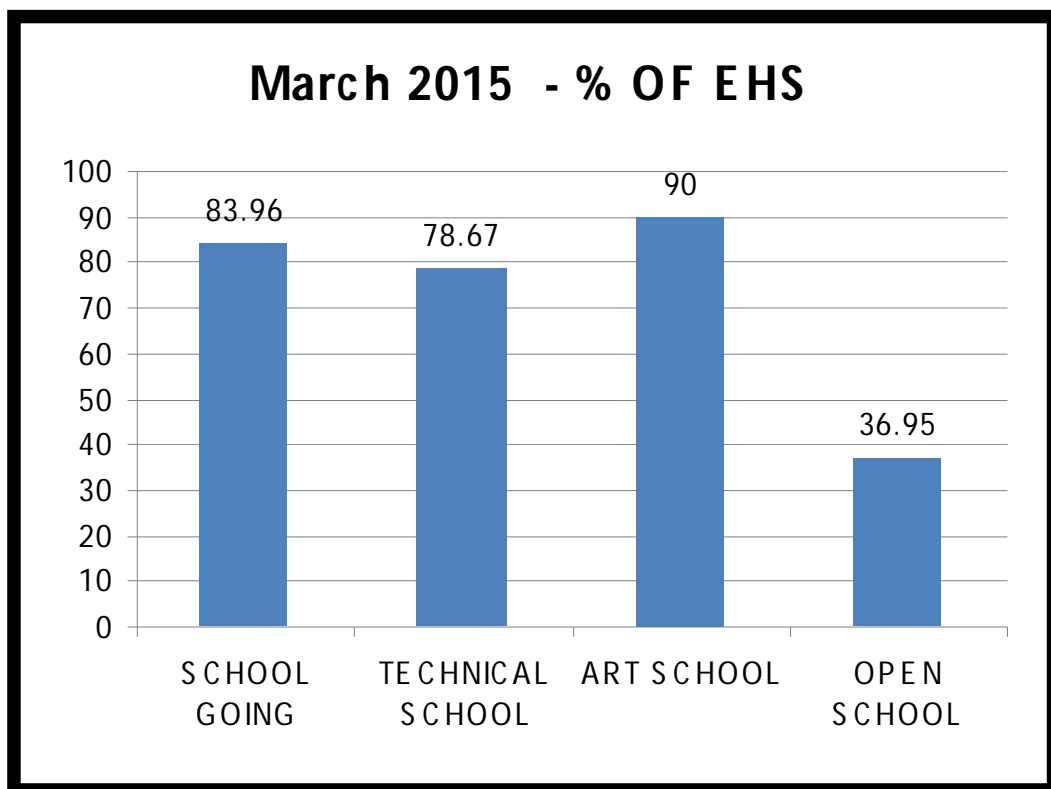

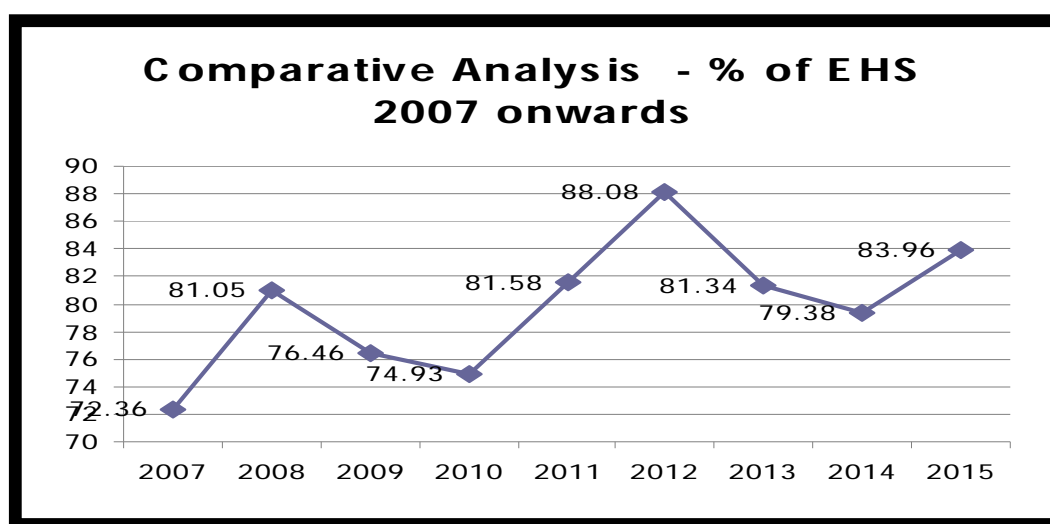
